## ART VOCABULARY

- <u>IHE [LEMENTS OF ART</u> The seven elements of art are *line, shape, space, value, form, texture, and color*. These elements are the building blocks, or ingredients, of art.
- <u>LINE</u> Line is the use of various marks, outlines, and implied lines during artwork and design. A line has a width, direction, curve, and length.
  - Bumpy
  - Wavy
  - Straight
  - Thick
  - Thin
  - $\circ$  Loopy
  - Swirly
- <u>SHAPE</u> A shape is two-dimensional, *flat*, or limited to height and width.
  - Geometric Geometric shapes come from geometry, which is the math of shapes made of points and lines. Geometric shapes are shapes made out of points and lines including the *triangle, square, and circle*.
  - Organic Organic shapes are defined as shapes that are *irregular* or asymmetrical in appearance and tend to have a curvy flow to them. Nearly *all shapes found in nature are organic* in appearance. Examples are leaves, flowers etc.
- <u>COLOR</u> Color is the element of art that is produced when light, striking an object, is reflected to the eye.
  - Primary Red, Yellow, Blue
  - Secondary Orange, Green, Purple
- <u>IEXTURE</u> They way that something *feels*.
  - Hard
  - Soft
  - Bumpy
  - Sticky

- Silky

- <u>SPA(E</u> The distances or areas around, between, and within components of a piece of art.
- <u>form</u> Form as an element of art is *three-dimensional* and encloses space. Like a shape, a form has length and width, but it also has *depth*.
  - $\circ$  Sphere
  - $\circ$  Pyramid
  - $\circ$  Cylinder
  - Rectangular Prism
- <u>VALUE</u> The relative *lightness* or *darkness* of a color.
- <u>COMPOSITION</u> The placement or arrangement of visual elements or 'ingredients' in a work of art.
